

RESOLUTION 2012-10

WHEREAS, natural, technological, and man-made hazards can affect the City of Martinsburg:
and

WHEREAS, significant structural, historical, and economic losses could result from an occurrence of a natural, technological, or man-made hazard events: and

WHEREAS, undertaking mitigation projects during pre-disaster periods could decrease the total losses the City of Martinsburg incurs as a result of said hazard occurrences.

WHEREAS, THE Martinsburg City Council has partnered with the Regional Planning and Development Council for Region 9 to regionalize the county's Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan in an effort to further identify, define, and characterize the hazards affecting the City of Martinsburg as well as to continue identifying and prioritizing projects that could lessen hazard vulnerability.

WHEREAS, the Martinsburg City Council has a strong interest in reducing losses from future hazard occurrences: and

WHEREAS, the hazard mitigation plan is a federal and state requirement to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation funding, and by that requirement, must be updated a minimum of every five (5) years: and


